For example, new students in Cumberland County Elementary Schools are required to have vaccinations and proper shots prior to enrollment. I have supported a program which allowed those who could not afford to purchase the vaccines until now. As many as 1,000 students are immunized per year and funding is provided by the local bank board of which I am a member.

**1993-2002 – Member of North Carolina Commission for Health Services-Dental representative** who sat on the state board of health whose primary responsibility is to restructure and vote on rules and regulations regarding the safety of the health of North Carolina citizens.

**1997-until 2010 – Donated monthly dental service to the Fayetteville Care Clinic.** My services included only the use of surgical skills to extract diseased teeth, remove cancerous and threatening lesions from the mouths of those citizens of Cumberland County who could not afford to visit a private dentist. See the enclosed article that was published in the North Carolina Dental Gazette, the state society journal. I am always prepared to go when needed. Sometimes, I have volunteered twice a month.

**2002- until now, The Caring 7 Plus –** a non-profit organization formed in a local barber shop. Seven men decided to form an organization whose yearly commitment is to feed homeless people a meal on Thanksgiving Day, buy and distribute food and toys to needy families during Christmas and give children gifts for the Easter holiday. To date my participation has included feeding people on Thanksgiving Day, soliciting volunteers and fundraising. For five events, I have raised more than \$7500 to support each project. Families are supported during Easter as well. Each year we feed 1100-1600 people.
